### Part 1 Croatia, Slovenia and Bosnia

This digital slide show starts in Zagreb, Croatia's capital, with views of ornate classical and baroque buildings and churches, a cemetery with sculptures worthy of an art gallery, colorful parks and gardens, and a folk museum. To the north is Ljubljana, Slovenia's vibrant capital with its citadel, parliament and markets, and a side trip to Postojna Caves, Europe's finest. Then north to the Julian Alps and the famous Lake Bled scenery. We travel to the coast to visit the Istrian Peninsula (Rovini, Motovun, Opatija, Pula) with its Italian flavor and a Roman coliseum. We next spend a day in Plitvice, a lush national park with water falls everywhere, before returning to the Dalmatian Coast to see Hvar and the walled cities of Split and Korchula, the home of Marco Polo. Returning inland we visit Mostar in Bosnia & Hercegovina, a country caught between Islam and Serbian orthodoxy. Finally we explore Dubrovnik, the jewel of the Adriatic Sea. A few preview images of part 2 will include Montenegro, Albania, Macedonia, Kosovo and Serbia. The show demonstrates the wide variety of ethnic music from polkas in the north to Arabic/ Turkish in the south.
