COLOR AND LIGHT IN NATURE

Guest Speaker — David Knight Lynch Monday, February 27 Clubhouse 3 Dining Room 2

David Knight Lynch will be guest speaker on the topic, "Color and Light in Nature". What is a rainbow? Why is the sky blue? Why is the setting sun red and flattened? What is an aurora borealis? Is it really darkest before dawn? Why are wet spots dark? These and dozens of other questions about naturally occurring optical effects are explained with pictures and diagrams, along with tips on how to see and photograph them.

David Knight Lynch received his Ph.D. in Astronomy in 1975 from the University of Texas in Austin. (His B.S. in Astrophysics in 1969) He is Senior Scientist at the Aerospace Corporation where he specializes in infrared spectroscopy of comets, novae, supernovae, young stars and very old stars. Dr. Lynch has held research positions at the Sacramento Peak Observatory, Caltech, UC Berkeley, Hughes Research Laboratories and The Aerospace Corporation. He has published over 160 scientific papers and 10 books. He is currently with the United States Geological Survey (USGS) in Pasadena where he studies the San Andreas Fault. We will see many recent pictures published by NASA.

Tom Getz will present a digital slide show titled "Destination Myanmar" (formerly Burma)

This show will feature the grandeur of golden temples, the majesty of ancient Buddhist shrines and pavilions and the life of the Burmese. From Yangon (formerly Rangoon), the Myanmar capital, we travel to the 800 year-old fields of temples at Bagan, then on to Mandalay for a fascinating boat trip on the Irrawaddy River and an evening marionette show. Village life at Lake Inle will be explored: cattle and food markets, fishing villages, scenes of ethnic tribes and life on the farms. Tom's show will strive for the unusual, such as Yangon's remaining synagogue, a rare Buddhist cemetery, murals, life in a monastery, cave art, folk dances, costumed nats (spirits), jumping cats, and a Burmese choir. The show will feature portraits, video clips, and ethnic music.
