





Judges Do Influence Each Other - Somewhat . . .

At our digital and print critiques and at our year-end judging, the Club employs professional judges to critique and score images. For our year-end judging three judges evaluate images from the year's critiques submitted by members. In 2017 the judges voted "publicly" (they could hear each other's comments and scorings for every image.) In 2019 the voting was private (judges voted by pressing buttons and could not see what the others had scored nor could they share comments.) When comparing data from these two years we noticed an interesting difference in the results.

Images are scored on a 7-point scale ranging from 6 to 9 in half-point increments. Thus, the midpoint score is 7.5. In 2017, 522 images were evaluated, and the average score was 8.0. In 2019, 507 images were evaluated, and the average rating was a bit lower: 7.8.

We wondered to what extent judges influence each other. To measure agreement, we computed the correlations among all three possible pairs of judges. In 2017 (the public situation) the average correlation was .71 (where 0 indicates no agreement at all and 1.00 indicates perfect agreement.) Thus, there was substantial agreement. In 2019 when they voted privately the correlation was only .48, indicating much less agreement.

Another way of measuring agreement is the amount of difference in scores given by the judges. In 2017, of the 522 scores, differences of 1.5 points occurred 6 times, and of 2 or more points occurred only 2 times. In 2019, of the 507 scores, there were 37 differences of 1.5 points, and 8 of 2 or more points. Thus, in the public situation only 1.5%

of the judgements had differences of 1.5 points or more, but in the private situation 9% of the judgements varied by that much - 6 times as many.

The range of image quality at year-end is truncated, as people would only submit their best work. In this situation we can see that some - undoubtedly subconscious - influence of the judges upon each other did exist.

Finding Your Photographic Style

Most of our camera club members enjoy photography as a hobby, would like to take better photos, and many want to enjoy getting out more often to take photos. Developing your own photo style would help improve your images and motivate you toward more outings to pursue photography. Observe the work of other members of the club for inspiration in finding what techniques and subjects appeal to you. Here are a few of many examples.

Weili Chen has a very artistic style in her photography. One technique Weili has used with success is camera movement to elongate buildings and people, blur subjects, or give an illusion of motion. Weili has also used double or multiple exposure with much success. Weili achieves artistic impact without compositional restraints of sharpness or subject placement while suggestive movement and colorful hues stimulate the imagination of the viewer.









Ken Furuta often uses shapes, diagonal lines and high contrast in his black and white images. Incorporating these elements into his monochrome photos has given Ken's photos a dynamic and unique look.

Finding Your Photographic Style - Cont'd

Betty Harper has mastered the style of minimalism. In this technique, Bette follows one excellent compositional guideline: fill the frame. Bette also uses leading lines, both "S" and "C" curves, and effective contrasting elements to draw the viewer into her images.

One area that most of us enjoy with our photography is travel. As we have seen from member showcases, few present better or more varied images from their trips than Tom Getz. One specialty Tom brings to his presentations is a focus on subject themes. Tom has presented shows on door-knockers, weather vanes, graffiti art, and other topics that are unique and define a sense of culture from his journeys. Tom's observations give him motivation and a photographic style to incorporate into his shows. My own examples in the next column show Tom's influence.

Finding a style in photography is often as simple as finding a subject matter that interests you. I can think of many of our Camera Club members whose work in various mediums is quite familiar to us. Examples of this are easy: cats and wild horses are often favorites of Susan Matsumoto, while flowers are frequently shown by Pat Wilkinson and leading lines by Russ Lazar. Jim Graver explores the world of tiny subjects with his macro photography, Rick Silverman impresses with brilliant landscapes, while Lawrie Bau often employs a black background to set off a stylish car grill or flower. Ron Harris brings fine architectural images to our critiques, many in black and white. Finally, Tim Talbert is a master of seascape photography and sells many of his images in local galleries. His creative soft-water style
