Four times a year, a guest judge from outside the club evaluates the entered images in front of the group so members and guests can learn from the judge's comments.

March will see a change in our Print Critique rules. We are allowing a Commercial Category to be included with the other listed categories in Color Pictorial only. If you are not comfortable in printing or matting your work, you may have up to four images printed and matted by others, but all other print critique rules still apply.

Our next critique is Saturday, March 20, at 10 AM, with up to four prints allowed in each category: Color Pictorial, Monochrome, and Altered Reality.

All prints must be turned in by Thursday, March 18, no later than 12 noon. Please have your name and print title on the back of each print, along with the entry card for each category. Place matted prints into the pre-labeled bins.

Tips from Cliff **Instant feedback**

A tool you get with a digital camera is the display on its back. Use the instant feedback that it gives you and review your shots - learning from your mistakes right after you've taken a picture. You don't have to wait a week until your pictures are developed anymore!!

And don't fall for the mega pixel hype. Especially with digital point-and-shoot cameras, a higher mega pixel count often results in more noise in your images. 5 mega pixels are enough for most situations.
